December Program

Bring Back the Red-Headed Woodpecker

If the vision of the speaker at the December 2 program of the Minneapolis Audubon chapter becomes reality, in a decade sightings of red-headed woodpeckers won't be a once-a-year-if-you're-lucky delight, but a fairly common sight, if you know where to look. That vision belongs to Chet Meyers, who will discuss the red-headed woodpecker recovery project that he and a group of dedicated conservationists began last year.

Chet will describe the plight of the woodpecker, whose numbers have drastically declined over the last twenty-five years. He will detail recent nesting data and the progress to-date of the recovery project that combines the efforts of the DNR non-game division, Audubon Society volunteers, and the Cedar Creek Ecosystem Science Research Reserve. The reserve, located in East Bethel, Minnesota, has one of the largest concentrations of the oak-savannah loving woodpeckers in the state. He also will explain what all of us who are concerned about the decline of the redheads can do to help restore a healthy population.

An avid bird watcher since 1985 and a member of the Minnesota Ornithological Union, Chet is a retired Metropolitan State University professor where he taught religion, philosophy, and natural science. When not looking out and listening for woodpeckers, he spends his spare time as a bird carver and angler.

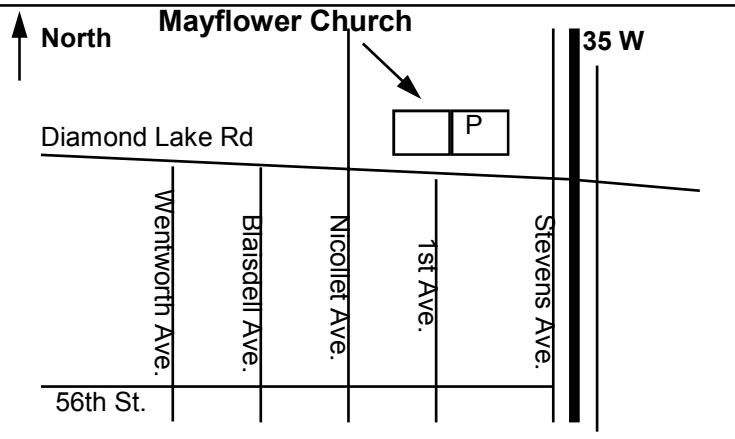

Seeking Field Guides for Schools

Staff of the Audubon Chapter of Minneapolis have been working closely with Harvest Academy this year enhancing their 5th-7th grade science curriculum with classroom presentations and bird watching field trips to nearby Theodore Wirth Park. The school library could benefit from additional field guides on all subjects: birds, insects, trees, plants, rocks etc. If you have gently used nature guides focusing on Minnesota and/or our region, please bring them to our December meeting. We will present our collective donation to the school after the holiday break.

Changes at Audubon Minnesota

Mark Peterson, Executive Director of Audubon Minnesota, announced some personnel changes at the Fall Meeting on November 8th. Susan Solterman, Audubon Minnesota's Policy Director has resigned and has been replaced by John Curry. John has worked as a lobbyist for MCEA and consequently brings a lot of experience to Audubon. Susan will continue to work, now as a volunteer, on the Environmental Issues Committee as well as being active in the St. Paul Audubon Society.

Joanna Eckles has been appointed as the Bird Safe Coordinator. She will now get paid to do much of what she has done as a volunteer. She will continue to work to get high rise building managers to turn off their lights during periods of bird migration. She will also coordinate the monitoring of bird collisions at buildings in Minneapolis and St. Paul. This important Audubon program would not have been started without her dedicated work. The Together Green funding from Toyota has made her hiring possible.

The third change has been the hiring of Bonnie Sample as the Minnesota Breeding Bird Atlas Coordinator. Bonnie is the Past-President of the St. Paul Audubon Society and a recent graduate of the University of Minnesota, earning a Masters Degree. Bonnie is busy reviewing other Breeding Bird Surveys in adjacent states and is recruiting regional coordinators who will help organize the statewide survey. Bonnie will begin recruiting birders to do the survey, beginning in 2009. The survey is expected to take a couple of years to complete. Audubon Minnesota was successful last legislative session in obtaining an LCCMR grant to fund the Breeding Bird Atlas project.

Audubon Chapter of Minneapolis wish John, Joanna and Bonnie good luck in their programs. If any of our members is interested in helping John, join the Environmental Issues Committee. Joanna will be again seeking volunteers to monitor buildings in Minneapolis for bird collisions. Bonnie will need many, many volunteers to go into the field to survey for breeding birds. Audubon Chapter of Minneapolis Bylaws Changes

Periodically the Audubon Chapter of Minneapolis Board reviews its Bylaws and changes them to correct a problem or to bring them up-to-date. A minor issue surfaced last year dealing with a Board member becoming an officer on the Board. It wasn't clear when the Board member becomes an officer if that then created a vacancy on the Board. The Board felt that it did not and language should be inserted into the Bylaws to clarify this.

Another minor item dealt with our State Fair Committee. Since Audubon Minnesota dropped its participation at the State Fair and decided to participate at the Living Green Expo, the name of this Committee should be changed to the Living Green Expo Committee.

Finally with the success of the Red-headed Woodpecker Recovery, the Board felt it ought to be given equal status with the Bluebird Recovery Program. Therefore the following changes to the Audubon Chapter of Minneapolis were approved by the Board.

In order for them to be incorporated into the Bylaws a vote by the membership is required. Therefore it is planned to hold a very brief business meeting before the Program Meeting on December 2nd to vote on the Bylaw changes.

The changes to the Bylaws as approved by the Board are as follows –

1. Add on page 1 – **“REVISION DECEMBER 2, 2008”** on next line after DECEMBER 7, 2004
2. On Bylaws page 2 insert **“If the newly elected officer is a sitting Board member that Board member will continue serving out their Board term.”** after “...and treasurer.”
3. On top of page 6 strike “STATE FAIR” and insert **“LIVING GREEN EXPO”**
4. On page 6, BYLAW 8, insert **“and RED-HEADED WOODPECKER RECOVERY”** after BYLAW 8 BLUE-BIRD RECOVERY PROGRAM. On line 1 delete “a” after first word “Being” and insert an “s” at end of word committee. On line 2 insert **“and the Red-headed Woodpecker Recovery (RhWR)”** after “(BBRP)”. On line 2 insert a “,” then a space after the word “bluebird” at the end of the line and then insert **“red-headed woodpecker”**. On line 5 insert **“and red-headed woodpecker”** after the word “bluebird” at the end of the sentence. On line 5 insert **“and Red-headed Woodpecker Recovery”** after the word “Program”.
